

OUR MISION

The mission of our behavioral health internship program is to expand the number of culturally competent behavioral health providers in the field and offer robust training in community mental health, resulting in well-trained behavioral health specialists who become licensed providers.

OUR VISION

Our vision for the behavioral health internship program is to offer robust, on-the-job clinical training for students in behavioral health, resulting in their choosing to work for our agency post-graduation. We anticipate that students participating in our program will be exposed to many different opportunities in community mental health, leading to a commitment to work in this area. Most importantly, we hope students in this internship program are committed to providing quality care to populations that often lack access to such services due to staffing shortages and/or a lack of culturally or linguistically appropriate clinicians.

APPLICANTS

MASTERS

These students will learn how to conduct assessments, provide individual therapy (both short-term and long-term), conduct family interviewing and family therapy, group therapy, intake evaluations, crisis intervention, care coordination, and consultation with community agencies.

- Currently enrolled in a graduate behavioral health program (MSW, MHC, etc.)
- Must be able to do a field placement that is a minimum of eight months and no less than 16 hours per week
- Liability insurance (through school or self)
- CORI/SORI and vaccinations required
- Comfortable using technology in care delivery (telehealth)
- Bilingual capacity; Preferred Languages:
 - Hatian Creole
 - Cape Verdean Creole
 - Vietnamese
 - Cantonese
 - Mandarin Chinese

PRE-COLLEGE & COLLEGE

This group will learn about the field of behavioral health, with a basic understanding of mental wellness and mental illness. This three-month internship program prepares students to become peer behavioral health advocates. They will assist in activities to destigmatize mental illness and normalize the utilization of behavioral health care among youth. The program is led by behavioral health clinicians who will train students in mental health first aid, stress management, coping skills, suicide, and substance use prevention, and how to be good listeners and identify the signs of mental distress.

Requirements:

- Currently enrolled in a precollege or college program
- Must be able to do a field placement for a minimum of three months
- CORI/SORI and vaccinations required
- Comfortable using technology in care delivery (telehealth)
- Bilingual capacity is preferred
